Augusta County Fire-Rescue Training Plan

Basic Training

Augusta County Fire-Rescue is responsible for providing entry level and advanced training to 86 career staff and over 500 active volunteers from 20 fire fire-rescue departments. The foundation of this training is the Firefighter Level 1 and 2 training that is offered. This training comes in the form of a newly formatted academy style training schedule that allows for the students to achieve certification or certificate of attendance in several disciplines. The academy begins in January of each year and concludes in June, meeting two nights a week and every other Saturday. The skills listed in the NFPA 1001 Standard for Fire Fighter Professional Qualifications are covered during the course of the 250 hours allotted for the program and include:

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- Ladders
- Ventilation
- Search and Rescue
- Hose
- Ropes and Knots
- Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus
- Salvage
- Overhaul
- Sprinklers
- Forcible Entry
- Portable Fire Extinguishers
- Wildland Ground Cover Fires
- Water Supply

While these skills are covered using the Jones and Bartlett Fundamentals of Fire Firefighter Skills, 3rd Edition textbook and materials, many more hours of hands on training is necessary to become proficient. Augusta County stretches over 900 square miles and currently utilizes a centrally located training facility to meet the demands of these training exercises. Due to the remoteness of some of our departments, it is extremely difficult for some agencies to come to the training facility for company level training exercises that extend beyond the entry level courses without fear of not being able to answer emergency calls. This generally results in the individual departments relying on acquiring training props, thus

increasing the financial and logistical burden on departments who are already overburdened with lack of manpower. Often times, this results in failure to conduct such training in the individual departments.

Regional Fire Service Training Enhancement

If Augusta County Fire-Rescue was to be awarded the Regional Fire Services Training Facility Grant from the Virginia Fire Services Board, the impact would be felt by hundreds of local volunteer and career firefighters. This reconfigurable maze system training prop that is being requested will be made to be mobile therefore allowing it to be taken around the various departments in the county. This prop would provide both initial and refresher training to many fire service personnel that may not have the opportunity to do so otherwise. The prop will play a significant factor in delivering adequate entry level training during the Firefighter Level I and MayDay FF Down courses facilitated in Augusta County and would be available to other neighboring jurisdictions if needed. While these props are historically constructed of combustible material at a lower cost, the system requested is able to be integrated with the burn building located in Augusta County as well as used as a stand-alone prop in a fire station or other facility. This prop will allow for countless training evolutions to take place without the need for repairing or replacing damaged portions of a combustible prop.

Annually, there are approximately 25 – 50 firefighters in our area that are able to participate in firefighter survival and MayDay FF Down operations training. With the addition of this training prop to our facilities, we could potentially see that same number of firefighters engaged in this type of training every month. The experience and training that would be provided with this prop is invaluable to all volunteer and career staff within our area.

We are pleased to provide you with the following quotation for a Reconfigurable Maze System [RMS]. The system provides realistic training to meet the objectives of NFPA 1001, Standard for Fire Firefighter and Professional Service Qualifications and the requirements of NFPA 1403, Standard on Live Fire Training Evolutions.

The portable props can be utilized in a standalone configuration or complimentary to a preexisting WHP maze panel system. The unit is easily set up anywhere, in a burn building, fire station, or any level surface.

Features and scenarios include Mayday and Denver style drills, entanglement props, SCBA training, inclines and declines, multi-level training and more. The system can be simply reconfigured for a wide variety of scenarios.

An example of a configuration of the components and an exercise would be trainees begin by ascending a sloped panel and arriving at an elevated passage. The passage leads to a *collapse floor prop* where the trainee tumbles into a cushioned section of the RMS [cushions not included]. The prop can be configured so either the floor tilts forward and the trainee slides into the collapse area, or crawls off of the edge of the floor into a cushioned area. After gaining composure, the trainee calls in a "Mayday". After extrication, the trainees navigate an *entanglement prop* where they attempt to free themselves. After reaching a wall, trainees must turn to proceed. A dead end is encountered and trainees exit through a *narrow window prop* to reach safety. The window prop can also be utilized as a wall breach.

MEMORANDUM of UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN AUGUSTA COUNTY FIRE-RESCUE AND THE CITY OF STAUNTON FIRE-RESCUE AND THE CITY OF WAYNESBORO FIRE DEPARTMENT

SUBJECT: Multi-Jurisdictional Regional Training Partnership

Purpose: The Augusta County Fire-Rescue Regional Training Facility, located at 180 Technology Drive, Staunton, Va. 24401 is owned and maintained by Augusta County. It is a facility funded by grant money received from the Virginia Department of Fire Programs, the Virginia Fire Services Board Burn Building Grant Program, as well as additional funding from the locality. The facility is open for all local and regional partners for their training needs. This MOU outlines the partnership for use of the building and associated training props between Augusta County career and volunteer agencies and the cities of Staunton, Waynesboro, and also inclusive of other regional partners.

Problem: There has been an increase on emphasis of training the staff in the local region in Mayday FF Down operations. There are logistical requirements necessary to facilitate these programs that are not readily available to our region. The construction of the necessary props are most typically of wood material that deteriorates over time. Training prop manufacturers have recently offered an option that eliminates the need to construct these props manually from ordinary combustible materials. This system consists of metal fabricated panels that provide various training to meet the NFPA 1001 and NFPA 1403 standards and include Mayday FF Down and Denver Drill, SCBA entanglement, collapsible floors, and window and wall breaching. By acquiring the Mayday and Maze Reconfigurable System, we will be able to provide training to several members of our local organizations simultaneously. The system will provide the option to train as an integrated part of the existing burn building as well as a standalone product in any fire station or similar training facility.

Scope: This MOU provides the understanding that Augusta County Fire-Rescue, along with County volunteer agencies who maintain the training facility mentioned above and all associated training props, the ability to use these props as needed unless otherwise in use. If the prop is used by the Cities of Staunton, Waynesboro, and/or other regional partners the respective locality would be responsible for maintaining the equipment and documenting any necessary repairs. Other localities outside of our region can also use the facilities when available and upon request.

Contracting Period: This Memorandum of Understand shall become effective upon its execution by all parties, and shall continue in effect until cancelled by any party, giving a ninety (90) day notice in writing to the other unless events render such notice impractical.

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Monetary Terms: This MOU further outlines that each user of the training prop shall document the condition of the panels and associated equipment at the beginning of each training exercise and again at the end of the exercise. The locality using the prop may be responsible for replacing all equipment that was damaged during the training exercise, pending investigation of the circumstances. This shall occur within 30 days of the end of the training exercise. Any agency wishing to utilize the training prop in their locality shall be responsible for the transportation of said prop, utilizing a department owned and insured vehicle. The department owned vehicle must have full comprehensive insurance coverage and the agency would be responsible for any and all costs associated with any incident or accident which may occur during transport, as well as any insurance deductible or non-coverage. In addition, the agency transporting must provide proof of said coverage prior to transporting.

Additional Terms: All personnel utilizing the training prop shall be knowledgeable in proper use, operation including safety operations in the event of an emergency. A pre-use inspection shall be performed prior to usage followed by a post-use inspection after the training event. Any defects prior to or after shall be corrected prior to usage by any personnel.
